FROM BOARD CHAIR & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we reflect on 2024, we are proud of the incredible progress made by the Sandusky County Communities Foundation and grateful for the continued generosity of our community. The Foundation Board of Trustees, staff, and community advisors kicked off the year with the creation of a new strategic plan for 2024-2026, aiming to double our asset size.



This year saw remarkable growth in both our assets and our ability to serve. Our assets grew from \$7.4 million to \$9 million, and we added 6 new funds, bringing our total to 44. The year was also one of collaboration and learning for our nonprofit partners. Through our Nonprofit Collaborative, we hosted meaningful roundtable discussions, educational events, and a board and volunteer fair. These initiatives fostered deeper connections within our community, helping nonprofits build capacity, share resources, and address challenges together.

The Foundation changed office locations to the county office building providing space for future growth. In October, we combined our annual Fund Holder update with our grant awards to create a Celebration of Philanthropy. This allowed the Foundation to better connect the people who care, like our fund holders, to causes that matter, like our local nonprofit organizations. In an exciting partnership, SCCF has teamed up with Chateau Winery & Vineyard to introduce "Foundation Red," a special wine that embodies the spirit of giving back. This collaboration is a unique opportunity for supporters to enjoy a local product while contributing to the betterment of Sandusky County.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are committed to building on these successes, expanding our educational offerings for nonprofits, and continuing to grow our planned giving program.

We remain dedicated to fostering philanthropy that transforms lives and enriches the future of Sandusky County. With your support, we are confident that we will continue to make a lasting impact, growing stronger as a community. Thank you for believing in our mission and for being a part of our shared journey.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING?

The Sandusky County Communities Foundation partnered with local nonprofits to host a "What is Planned Giving" event, featuring Nick Kulick from the University of Toledo Foundation. Nonprofit leaders and donors learned about the importance of planned giving programs and estate planning through presentations and a Q&A with local professional advisors.



STRATEGIC PLANNING 101

The Sandusky County Communities Foundation and United Way of Sandusky County hosted a successful "Strategic Planning 101" class for over 40 nonprofit leaders. Thanks to Brant Duda of Strategy Design Partners, participants gained actionable insights to enhance long-term growth and strengthen their operations and mission.



NONPROFIT SITE VISITS

The Sandusky County Communities Foundation conducted 28 nonprofit site visits, deepening partnerships, sharing resources like grants and connections, and featuring organizations on social media to celebrate their impact and encourage community involvement. These visits strengthen our understanding of each nonprofit's mission and the residents they serve.



NONPROFIT BOARD AND VOLUNTEER FAIR

The second annual Sandusky County Nonprofits Board and Volunteer Fair, hosted with Sandusky County Young Professionals and Leadership Sandusky County, connected community members with local nonprofits. Attendees learned about missions, discovered ways to get involved, enjoyed complimentary appetizers, and entered to win a tailgate-themed raffle basket!



COFFEE + COMMUNITEA

In 2024, we launched COFFEE + CommuniTEA, a casual event to connect with Executive Director Andrea Gibson to learn about the Foundation's impact through grants and scholarships, and discover ways to get involved. Attendees enjoyed their favorite morning beverage on us, while exploring how philanthropy is strengthening Sandusky County.

CELEBRATION OF PHILANTHROPY

On October 10, 2024 the Foundation welcomed over 100 attendees to the first annual Celebration of Philanthropy. With the purpose of the event to honor the Foundation's fund holders, donors, and supporters, provide important updates, and celebrate community grant recipients. The event symbolized the Foundation's



motto of "Connecting People who Care with Causes that Matter". Since the launch of its community grant program in 2009, SCCF has awarded \$1.15 million in discretionary funds to non-profits throughout Sandusky County.
